





















FOUNDATION:

ISLAND SYSTEMS MANAGEMENT (ISM)

- ✓ An adaptive management strategy which provides the necessary policy orientation to manage the complexities of the interaction between ecosystems from ridge to the outer limits of the EEZ and the anthropogenic impacts on them.
- ✓ It integrates and coordinates the initiatives of all sectors, both public and private, to ensure the achievement of common goals.
- ✓ Continuous and dynamic process by which decisions are taken for the sustainable use, development, and protection of an island's resources.



FOUNDATION:

ISLAND SYSTEMS MANAGEMENT (ISM)

- i. Integration (inter-sectoral, intergovernmental, spatial ...);
- ii. Environmental stewardship;
- iii. Stakeholder participation;
- iv. Use of sound science and best practice, inclusive of **local** and traditional knowledge;

 - Raise awareness about the Escazú Agreement in the Eastern Caribbean among OECS Member States, interested stakeholders and the general public;
 - b) Undertake strategic advocacy and disseminate information and knowledge on the Escazú Agreement;
 - Develop and conduct training programmes, workshops, seminars and associated projects, with specific emphasis on training of trainers and the promotion of the implementation of the Escazú Agreement;
 - d) Elaborate joint studies, publications, reports, policy formulation and analytical work on the environmental dimension of sustainable development and the Escazú Agreement;




CONSULTANCY SERVICES: Enhancing the generation, collection and systemization of environmental information in the Eastern Caribbean: Environmental Information Systems (Oct 2020)



- **Stocktaking** on existing or proposed environmental information systems.
- Review the frameworks related to access to environmental information.
- Identify gaps, strengths and opportunities in environmental information systems, including in terms of capacity, training, resources, institutional arrangements, monitoring, reporting, assessment, private and civil sector engagement, crosssectoral integration, access and application of information, communication and outreach.
- Survey identifying the needs and priorities on developing a regional environmental information system for the Eastern Caribbean region.
- Structure of a sub-regional environmental information system, including suggested content, technical requirements and reporting, institutional, operational and governance guidelines and arrangements.

LEVELS

Level 3 builds on Levels 1 and 2, providing comprehensive in-depth analysis of progress made towards the Vision, Goals and Objectives of SGD 2040 as well as recommendations for the future consideration.

Level 2 builds on Level 1, providing more in-depth interpretation of data and analysis of specific Strategic Priorities.

Level 1 Member States report against specific "Progress Measures" designed to show their level of progress for each of the Outcomes defined in SGD 2040.
